ITEM 1: Map skills

Map skills are important for they help learners interprete geographical phenomena on different survey maps. This helps them understand symbols as represented on the actual ground as apposed to pictures. It is a planning tool too since inaccessible areas such as large lakes, forests and swamps can be clearly seen using these maps. Using the knowledge you have on map interpretation, study the East Africa 1:50,000(UGANDA)map extract of LUKAYA series Y732, SHEET 79/2, Edition 3-USD and answer the tasks given.

TASK

- (a) (i) Otim is a senior four candidate of a school South of Kiti at grid reference 731916. In the evening he goes home and takes an angle of 225° from the school. What is the direction of his home? (02 scores)
 - (ii) Lukaya Town Council with the help of Uganda National Roads
 Authority (UNRA) plans to renovate the bound surface road from grid
 reference 800866 to grid reference 860928. As a student of geography,
 help them determine the distance of the road in question in miles.

(iii) If the cost of renovating the road in (a) (ii), above is said to be 432 millions shillings per Kilometer, how much will it cost the Uganda National Roads Authority (UNRA) to complete the project? (04 scores)

- (b) (i) Due to land scarcity in Lukaya especially the sub-country of Sabawali, government plans to reclaim part of Lake Victoria shown on the map.

 The cost of reclaiming each square kilometer is Ugandan shillings 321 million. How much money does the government need to reclaim the part of the lake shown?

 - (ii) The local community especially the fishmen, and peasant farmers whose livelihood is solely dependent on Lake Victoria are opposed to the government plan to reclaim the lake.






TASK


