### NOTES

In the context of responding to Islamic Religious Education tasks, it's essential to structure your points effectively to achieve maximum scores in Conceptual Knowledge (CK), Islamic Teaching (CU), and Link/Application (APP).

**Conceptual Knowledge** involves clearly defining and explaining key concepts within Islamic teachings. **Islamic Teaching** requires citing relevant verses; or Hadiths; or bringing out a teaching of Islam and understanding their context. Finally, **Link/Application** emphasizes connecting theoretical knowledge to real-life scenarios, encouraging practical implementation of Islamic principles.

How to get the skills/competences during scoring; Write a point (to get a **CK** score), explain the point (to get a **CU** score), Apply / link a point to get (an **APP** score). However, Responses should be in line with indicators in the scenario.

The guidelines for drawing responses in the context of **Conceptual Knowledge**, **Islamic Teaching**, and **Link/Application**. Each category serves a specific purpose.

## 1. Conceptual Knowledge (CK)

### Definition:

Conceptual knowledge refers to understanding the underlying principles, theories, and ideas within a subject area.

### **Guidelines:**

- Define Key Concepts: Start with clear definitions of important terms.
- Explain Relationships: Discuss how concepts are interconnected.
- Use Examples: Provide concrete examples to illustrate abstract ideas.

Example:

If discussing **justice in Islam**, you might define it as "the quality of being fair and reasonable." You could explain that justice in Islam is rooted in the Qur'an and Sunnah, highlighting that it applies to all aspects of life, including legal matters, interpersonal relationships, and community welfare. An example could include the concept of **Zakat** (charity), illustrating how it promotes social justice by redistributing wealth.

## 2. Islamic Teaching (CU)

**Definition:** Islamic teaching refers to the guidance provided by the Qur'an, Hadith (sayings of the Prophet Muhammad), and the broader Islamic tradition.

## **Guidelines**:

- **Cite Sources:** Reference specific verses from the Qur'an or Hadith to support claims.
- **Contextual Understanding:** Discuss the context in which teachings were revealed or established.
- **Highlight Diversity:** Acknowledge different interpretations and schools of thought within Islam.

## Example:

When addressing **compassion in Islam**, you could cite the Qur'an (e.g., Surah Al-Anfal chapter 8 verse 61) which emphasizes the importance of peace and compassion among believers. Explain the historical context, such as the early Muslim community's struggles and the emphasis on mercy during conflicts. You could also mention different interpretations from scholars on how compassion can be applied in modern contexts, such as in social justice movements.

# 3. Link/Application (APP)

# Definition:

This involves connecting the theoretical knowledge and teachings to practical situations and real-life applications.

# **Guidelines:**

- Identify Practical Implications: Discuss how concepts or teachings can be applied in everyday life.
- Draw Parallels: Link theoretical ideas to contemporary issues or personal experiences.
- **Encourage Reflection:** Ask questions that prompt further consideration or action.

#### Item 1

Jamilah of Kiviya town likes participating in social functions. She celebrates Eid with her non-Muslim neighbours. Recently she invited her friends and family to celebrate the birth of her daughter. On another occasion, she went to celebrate her sister-in-law's successful completion of university studies. She has also just attended a Traditional marriage ceremony of her schoolmate. However, one of her sons, Ismail, who refused to attend all the functions with his mother, requested her to stop attending the ceremonies.

### Tasks

- a) Basing on the scenario, explain the Islamic teachings on ceremonies to enable Ismail accept the conduct of his mother.
- b) How are some ceremonies in Traditional African Society related to those in the scenario above?

## **POSSIBLE RESPONSES**

a) Basing on the scenario, explain the Islamic teachings on ceremonies to enable Ismail accept the conduct of his mother.

### Introduction

In the context of Islamic Religious Education, understanding the teachings and practices surrounding social ceremonies is essential. The scenario of Jamilah and her participation in various social functions provides an opportunity to explore Islamic teachings about community engagement and celebrations, which can help her son Ismail understand her actions better.

## Responses to Task (a): Islamic Teachings on Ceremonies

Ismail may see that Jamilah's attendance at these ceremonies aligns with Islamic values of community and connection.

Ismail might realize that by allowing his mother to engage in these activities, they contribute to a harmonious and united community.

# b) How are some ceremonies in Traditional African Society related to those in the scenario above?

# Responses to Task (b): Abuse of Allah's Provisions
